Local Law No. of 2025

A Local Law entitled "Local Law No. ___ of 2025, Extending Term of Office of Supervisor".

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Amenia as follows:

Section I: TITLE.

This Local Law shall be known and cited as Town of Amenia "Local Law No. ____ of the Year 2025, Extending Term of Office of Supervisor".

Section II: LEGISLATIVE INTENT.

The Town Board has determined that for purposes of continuity and efficiency in Town government, it would be in the best interest of the Town and its citizens to change the term of office of the Office of the Supervisor to four years.

Section III: AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 29. TERMS OF OFFICE.

Chapter 29 of the Code of the Town of Amenia shall be amended and read as follows:

"Chapter 29: TERMS OF OFFICE

ARTICLE II. SUPERVISOR

§29-7. Term.

The term of office of elective Town Supervisor of the Town of Amenia shall be four years. Such four-year term shall commence on the first day of January following the first biennial Town election after the effective date of this Article.

§ 29-8. Election.

At the biennial Town election next following the effective date of this Article, and every four years thereafter, the Town Supervisor shall be elected for a term of four years.

§ 29-9. Supersession.

This Article shall supersede in its application to the Town of Amenia § 24 of the Town Law of the State of New York and any inconsistent local law, ordinance, or resolution with respect to the term of office of elective Town Supervisor.

§ 29-10. Mandatory referendum.

This Article shall be submitted for approval by mandatory referendum to the electors of the Town of Ameria at the next general election to be held on November 4, 2025.

§ 29-11. Statutory authority.

This Article is submitted pursuant to the authority vested in the Town pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law § 10(1)(ii)(a)(1) and Municipal Home Rile Law § 10(1)(ii)(d)(3).

§ 29-12. Effective date.

This Article shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State after approval of a majority of the electors voting thereon in accordance with the requirements of § 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law."

Section IV: SEVERABILITY.

- A. If a court of competent jurisdiction finds any provision(s) of this law invalid, in whole or in part, the effect of such decision shall be limited to those provisions which are expressly stated in the decision to be invalid, and all other provisions of the law shall continue to be separately and fully effective.
- B. If a court of competent jurisdiction finds the application of any provision of this law to any building, other structure of tract of land to be invalid, in whole or in part, the effect of such decisions shall be limited to the person, property or situation involved in the controversy, and the application of any such provision to any other person, property or situation shall not be affected.
- C. The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity, or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability, shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words or parts of this Local Law or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the Town Board of the Town of Amenia that this Local Law would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and if such person or circumstance to which the Local Law or part thereof is held inapplicable had been specifically exempt therefrom.

Section V: NUMBERING FOR CODIFICATION.

It is the intention of the Town of Amenia and it is hereby enacted that the provisions of this Local Law shall be included in the Code of the Town of Amenia, that the sections and sub-sections of this Local Law may be re-numbered or re-lettered by the Codifier to accomplish such intention; the Codifier shall make no substantive changes to this Local Law; the word "Local Law" shall be changed to "Chapter", "Section" or other appropriate word as required for codification; and any such rearranging of the numbering and editing shall not affect the validity of this Local Law or the provisions of the Code effected thereby.

Section VI: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State after approval of a majority of the electors voting thereon in accordance with the requirements of § 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

WHEREAS, the Town of Amenia, Dutchess County, New York (hereinafter the "Town"), has established the public benefit of undertaking necessary infrastructure upgrades for residents of Water District #1; and

WHEREAS, the project includes replacing the Lavelle Road pump house, rehabilitating the water storage tank, upgrading the well fields on Washington Court and Lavelle Road, and replacing undersized water mains within the Water District #1 service area; and

WHEREAS, the Town has duly caused to be prepared a Map, Plan, and Report (MPR), including an estimate of the cost relating to said improvement of facilities of Water District #1, pursuant to an Engineering Report dated December 2024, prepared by Delaware Engineering, D.P.C., professional engineers; and

WHEREAS, the maximum estimated cost to Water District #1 of such improvements is determined to be \$3,902,850; and

WHEREAS, all expenses for any future debt repayment and capital charges for the aforesaid improvements shall be divided among all parcels within the Water District by benefit points assigned according to land type; and

WHEREAS, expenses for operation and maintenance for the aforesaid Water District shall be determined in two parts: first, the fixed costs of operation such as personnel salaries and annual contract costs shall be divided by the total assigned O&M points in the Water District and, second, the water use rate shall be determined by subtracting the fixed costs from the annual operation expenses and then dividing this amount by the total water consumed in the previous four quarters per one thousand gallons; and

WHEREAS, an environmental analysis has been prepared pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act in connection with such improvements to the facilities of said District, and it has been determined that such improvements and use will not result in any significant environmental effects; and WHEREAS, it is now desired to call a public hearing on said proposed improvements of facilities and the Map, Plan, and Report, including an estimate of cost, pursuant to Section 202-b of the Town Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT, ORDERED by the Town Board of the Town of Amenia, Dutchess County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Amenia, Dutchess County, New York, shall be held at Amenia Town Hall, located at 4988 NY-22, Amenia, NY 12501, on ________, 2025 at 7:00 P.M., Prevailing Time, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the improvements of the facilities of Water District #1 in said Town, consisting of:

- Replacement of the Lavelle Road Pump House with a prepackaged pump house,
- Rehabilitation of the existing 200,000-gallon water storage tank,
- Upgrades to the Washington Court and Lavelle Road Well Fields, and
- Replacement of approximately 1,260 linear feet of undersized water mains,

together with all related and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith. At such time and place, said Town Board will hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same.

Section 2. A copy of the MPR is available for review at the Office of the Town Clerk.

Section 3. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause a notice of said public hearing to be published in the official newspaper of said Town, and posted in the manner prescribed by law, which notice shall be in substantially the following form:

- Upgrades to the Washington Court and Lavelle Road Well Fields, and
- Replacement of approximately 1,260 linear feet of undersized water mains,

together with all related and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, at a maximum estimated cost of \$3,902,850, at which time and place said Town Board will hear all persons interested in the subject thereof concerning the same.

Such cost shall be divided among all parcels within the Water District by benefit points assigned according to land type.

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2024, almost two (2) years after the original review, LaBella was informed by NYS DOT that an additional 35 items needed to be addressed prior to the issuance of a DOT Work Permit, which were contrary and in addition to the prior comments responded to in the original design submittal; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the Project has been significantly increased by the additional 35 items required by NYS DOT and the Town Board feels it is in the best interest of the Town to terminate the contract with Raja pursuant to paragraph 16.03 of the General Conditions of their contract; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Amenia is now seeking to re-bid the project in accordance with the new bid specifications.
